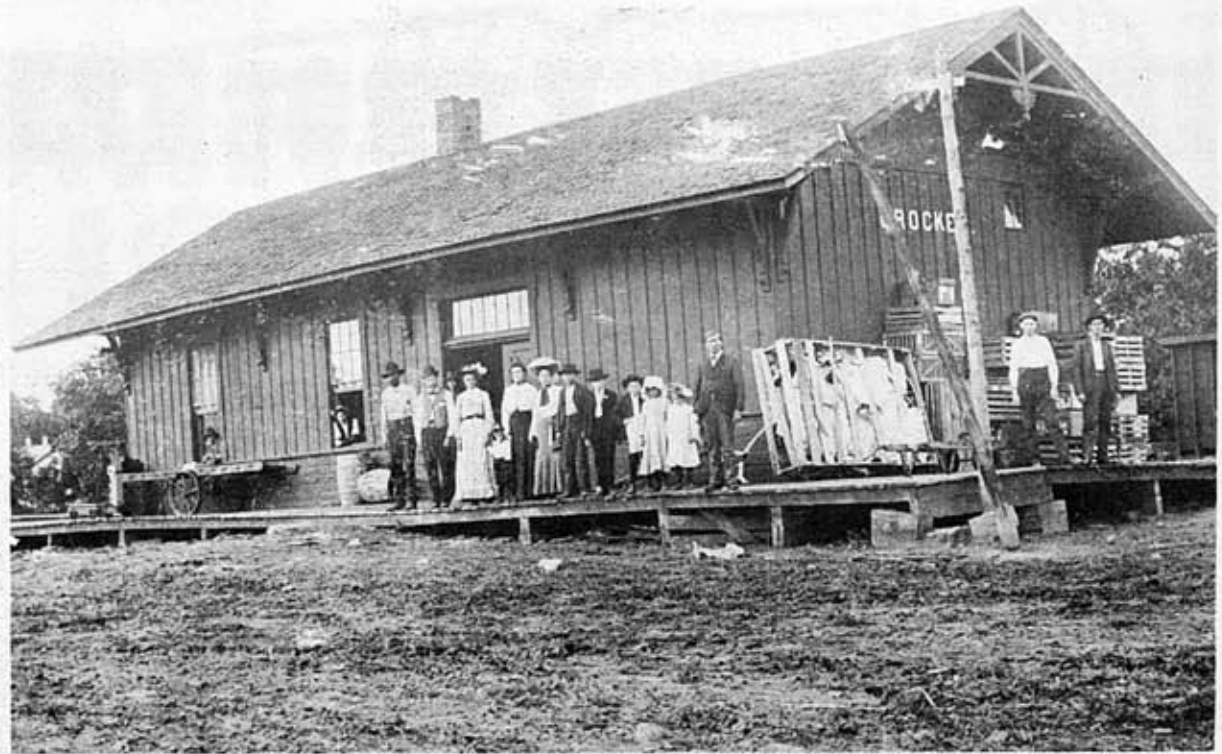
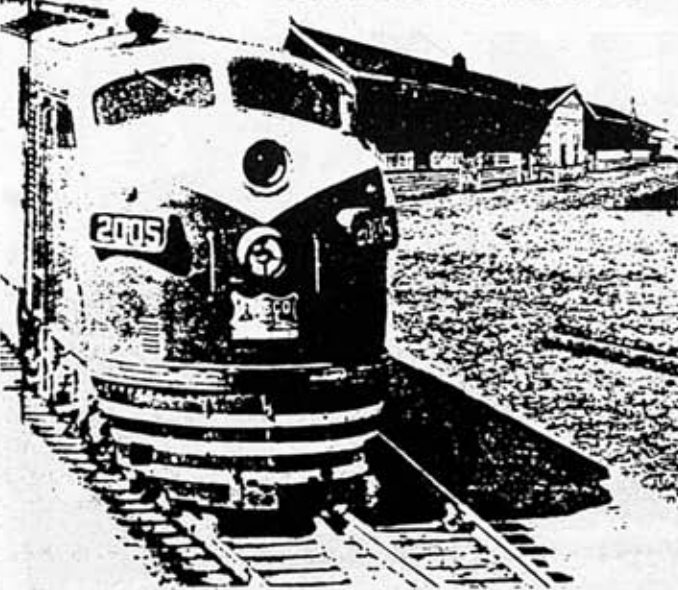


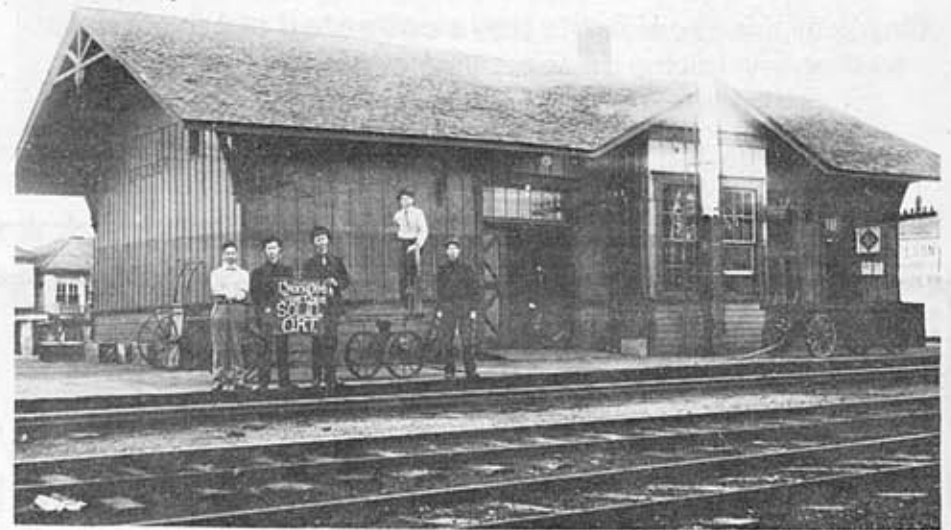

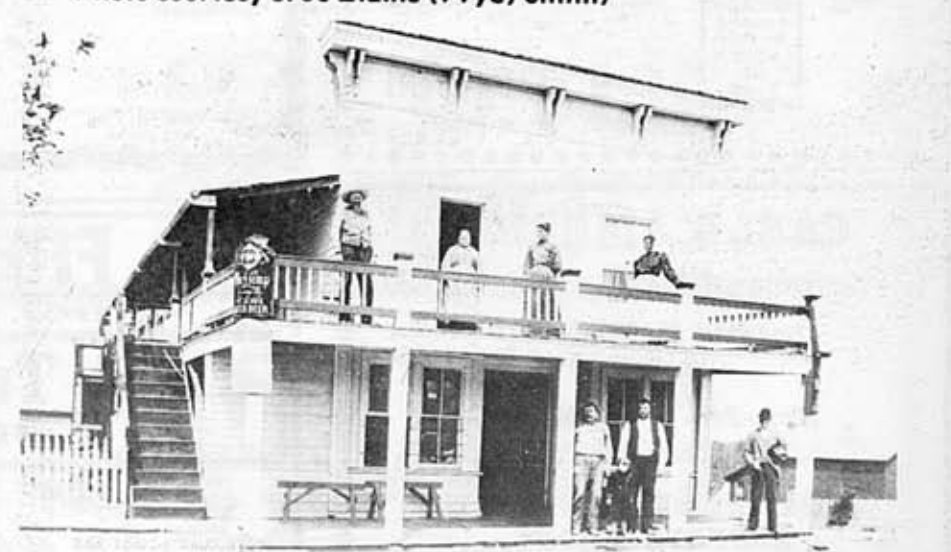

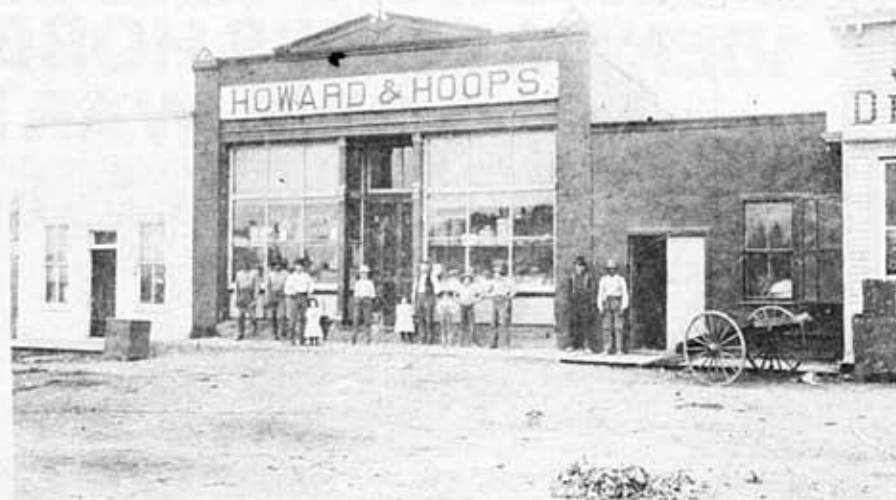
First Pulaski County Hospital built in Crocker by Dr. Stebbins shortly after the turn of the century. Sanatorium was a polite name for a hospital in those days.
