
The museum will be open to the public full time starting at 11 a.m., July 25 during Old Settler's Days. Special events that day include speeches from local dignitaries and a play titled, "The Trial of Eliza Black" presented by the LEAP class students. Visitors can see a mural of the Waynesville area, a past to present Waynesville diorama, a photogrpahic collection featuring Devil's Elbow, the Pulaski County land records and law books, and the Genealogy Society Room. The Genealogy Society Room houses books for sale including Volumes One and Two of the Pulaski County History Book, Volumes One and Two of the Cemetery books, and a book on Pulaski County schools. The Fort Leonard Wood Museum plans to have a special display about Fort Leonard Wood's role in Pulaski County history.

The Pulaski County Museum will be open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The museum will al-

so open during Mondays following holidays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. During Old Settler's Days, door prizes will be given away to visitors to the museum. 
