



## The Cross-Eyed Method

The two stereoscopic pairs are arranged to be viewed in 3-D with the viewer's eyes crossed. The right eye should view the picture on the left and the left eye should view the picture on the right. Hold your index finger about halfway between your eyes and the page.


Focus on the finger. In the distance you will see two separate images of the stereo pair. Remove your finger and adjust your eyes so that the center images overlap. You should now see three images, with the center one in 3-D. Now, shift the focus of your eyes, without moving them, from close-up to more distant focus to bring the center image into sharp definition without breaking the center overlap. It will require some practice to develop the dexterity for the process.
















