At Hancock on Sunday last, George Moore shot Small Bacon in the legs. They had been playing cards and a dispute arose between Moore and John Egan and they fought. Egan went home and returned after supper with Bacon and some, other section men, and when passing Moore's house, some one threw a rock through Moore's window. Moore grabbed his shotgun and ran out and shot into the crowd, wounding Bacon, as above stated. Dr. Rollins, of Dixon, was summoned by telegram and dressed Bacon's wound.
